Day 1 –Mumbai to London-

Arrive at the London Airport, Welcome to London. On arrival, we proceed towards the hotel. In evening visit-

The Coca-Cola London Eye-The Coca-Cola London Eye offers breathtaking views of London from high above the River Thames. See Big Ben towering above the Houses of Parliament, follow St. James Park as it sweeps down to Buckingham Palace.

When You reach London Eye just don't forgot to book your table at 47th Floor Restaurant at the Shrad, Shangri – La Hotel opposite to London

London Tower Bridge - Enter one of the most famous bridges in the world, to explore its legendary structure. With your entrance ticket to the London Tower Bridge, experience the spectacular views of London and see through its glass floor, modern exhibitions and magnificent Victorian Engine Rooms.

Big Ben- Big Ben, tower clock, famous for its accuracy and for its massive bell. ... The tower itself was formally known as St. Stephen's Tower until 2012, when it was renamed Elizabeth Tower on the occasion of Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee, celebrating 60 years on the British throne.

Day 2 –London-

After breakfast at the hotel we will visit - **Stonehenge, Bath and Windsor Castle, London.**

Baths and Bath Abbey Windsor Windsor – awash with natural beauty, discover the 17th century historical monuments which line its cobbled streets. Fans of the Royal family will be in their element! Steeped in history, you will have the option to visit the home of Queen Elizabeth II and enjoy a through the keyhole experience of the world's largest and oldest castle. Stonehenge Situated on Salisbury Plain, 40 ton rocks stand alone since their arrival 5,000 years ago. Abundance of theories surround Stonehenge; from a religious temple to an astronomical clock and even a Bronze Age burial ground! Decide for yourself whilst discovering the history of this mysterious monument. Bath Standing proudly on the slopes of the River Avon, beautiful bath was the first city in England to be designated an UNESCO World Heritage site. The gorgeous 15th century Bath Abbey, the stunning Georgian architecture, the romantic Pulteney Bridge, modeled on Florence's Ponte Vecchio, are all sights to linger on in the memory of your day. Explore the delights of Bath at your leisure. Entrances not included in the price of the tour. This tour will finish at approximately 7:30pm in London.

Day 3 –London-

After breakfast in the hotel we will visit **Best of London - Buckingham Palace, Trafalgar Square, Madame Tussauds London**

Buckingham Palace - Buckingham Palace has served as the official London residence and administrative office of the British royal family since the 19th century and is one of the few remaining working royal palaces in the world. Access for the public is limited and exclusive but worthwhile for those who arrange a visit. Buckingham Palace is one of England's most famous landmarks. Visitors can always view its opulent exterior through the gates, but visits must be timed right to tour the interior. During its summer opening, travelers can peek into the state rooms, see the Throne Room, stroll through the palace gardens, and admire masterpieces by artists such as Rembrandt and Canaletto in Queen Victoria's Picture Gallery.

Changing of Guard- Changing the Guard, also known as Guard Mounting, takes place outside Buckingham Palace from 10.45am and lasts around 45 minutes, with the actual handover taking place at 11am. The Changing of the Guard is the official ceremony when the Foot Guards currently

guarding the monarchy (the Old Guard) are released from their duty, to be replaced with new soldiers (the New Guard).

Trafalgar Square- As the gateway between the main shopping district of the city centre and the West of the city, Trafalgar Square is famous for being the home of the National Gallery and the National Portrait Gallery, alongside the iconic Nelson's Column. William Railton designed the column and statue to honour Admiral Nelson, after his victory in the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805. The granite statue was sculpted by E. H. Baily. It is five metres high and stands on a bronze platform made from old guns from the Woolwich Arsenal Foundry. The famous statues of four lions in Trafalgar Square, surrounding Nelson's Column, are commonly known as the 'Landseer Lions' after the artist who created them.

Madame Tussauds London- It used to be spelled as "Madame Tussaud's"; the apostrophe is no longer used. Madame Tussauds is a major tourist attraction in London, displaying the waxworks of famous and historical figures, as well as popular film and television characters from famous actors.

Day 4 – London -

After breakfast in the hotel we will visit -Costwold oxford stratford shakespeare and spired, London Our first stop of the day is the charming market town of Stratford-Upon-Avon! You will also have time to explore this charming town, and our guide will advise you on all the best sites to see.

We then take a drive through England's most famous countryside, the Cotswolds, admiring the scenery on the way. Marvel at the beautiful landscape in this protected Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. We stop at a Cotswolds village for photos and a chance to enjoy this lovely village.

Onwards to Oxford, where we will give you ample time to enjoy the most famous university city in the world. Your guide will introduce you to the city, and recommend a walking route which will allow you to see many of the famous buildings of the city, including the Bridge of Sighs, Christchurch Cathedral and the many beautiful colleges.

- Waverley Bridge - This recognisable structure is the starting point of the hop-on hop-off tour, but note that you can join the bus at any point along the route, and enjoy unlimited journeys for your chosen time period. This bridge is an important connecting component of Edinburgh that links the two sides of the city together.

World of Illusions:

As you weave your way through our World of Illusions, remember one important rule: nothing here is what it seems.

Venture into five floors full of things you've probably never seen before. A swirling light vortex that can sweep you off your feet. A maze made of mirrors. A chance to swap noses with a friend. It's all here.

Camera Obscura show:

A dark room. A large table. A beam of light. When you walk into our special rooftop chamber, things seem pretty straightforward. But wait. An image of Edinburgh appears on the table. The narrow closes of the Old Town. The sophisticated crescents of the New Town. What happens next is like nothing you've seen before.

There are no projectors here – just clever Victorians with technology that brought moving pictures to the people of Edinburgh, long before cinema was invented. Watch as your guide leads you on a fascinating adventure through (and over) this UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The people you can see are real – and are walking down Edinburgh's streets at this very moment. Scoop them up. Squash them. Build bridges for them to drive over – all without leaving the room. This is the original virtual reality, Victorian style.
